## **Description**

The primary focus of this learning module is to enhance students' language competence at an A2 level on the Common European Framework of reference for languages. At this level, commonly referred to as 'threshold', students will be moving towards;

- understanding the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc.
- dealing with most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where the language is spoken.
- producing simple connected text on topics that are familiar or of personal interest.
